

Plough Sunday - 15th Jan. 3.30pm at Ripon Cathedral

This rapidly growing annual event draws together about 300 civic leaders, senior members of the rural community, farmers and landowners, Young Farmers Club members, and rural ministers (ecumenical) to celebrate the rural year. A different YFC "Brings in the Plough" each year to request the Bishop's blessing for the agricultural year. The guest speaker this year is Poul Christensen—President of the national Young Farmers' Clubs. The Service will be accompanied by the Ripon Cathedral Choir and there will be Methodist, Anglican and Roman Catholic ministers from the Dales taking part—including Deacon Maggie.

From 2.30 there is an exhibition of rural charities, sword-dancing (non-liturgical!) and a free hot sandwich and cake lunch.... and Ripon Farm Services always exhibit one or two of their latest tractors on the Cathedral forecourt.

Friends of Malham Chapel

On Sunday 20th November 2016 the Friends of Malham Chapel (FoMC) held their inaugural meeting at the Chapel.

A development group has been appointed to move forward the vision for Malham Chapel, which is to provide an all-age and all-weather space with full access possible for those with disabilities. To improve the aspect at the front of the building to showcase it's stunning setting and allow passing tourists a glimpse of the interior of the chapel to encourage them to take a look inside. Finally, at the centre of the floor, a pictorial representation of Malhamdale as a focus for prayer and conversation.

Moving forward we envisage possible roles for FoMC in these areas:

Prayer – a network of folk holding the place and people in prayer, and offering the work as a subject for prayer in their fellowships.

Presence – a number of people willing to spend time offering welcome at the Chapel, particularly at times of high visitor numbers e.g. The Safari, The Show and Bank Holiday weekends.

Publicity – the possibility of finding people both to produce and to distribute publicity materials and stories, including the good use of social media (e.g. a FoMC Facebook page).

Skills – the identification of skills needed in the development of the work, and the potential for finding people with these skills from a wider pool than the local community.
